A Study of Tattoos and Employment Practices in the EU and the USA:

Insights These Practices Can Provide for Japanese Organizations

<Abstract>

This study examines recruiter attitudes toward tattooed applicants, tattoo policy trends, and employee response to tattoo policy on the basis of EU and USA experiences.

In the EU and the USA, the number of tattooed people has been increasing, and many organizations have an official tattoo policy. Previous research in the hospitality industry has shown that tattooed job applicants might be negatively evaluated. Nevertheless, as the number of tattooed applicants and employees continues to rise, tattoo policies are tending to be relaxed. Case studies of tattoo-related conflicts between employees and organizations reveal the implication of religious, racial, and sexual discrimination in this area.

The EU and USA experiences may provide useful information for Japanese organizations as they develop policies related to tattoos and employment practices in the future.

A Leader Is the One Who Sets the Tone of Corporate Culture :

Rethinking the Difficulty of Democratic Discourse in Organizations

<Abstract>

Due the necessity of management in organizations, democratic discourse between management and workers is not easily attained. However, nowadays most corporations demand communication skills from new employees. After interviewing workers and scrutinizing third-party reports from various disgraced organizations using the grounded theory method, this paper concludes that conducting democratic discourse is almost impossible from the workers' side. Rather, the management should acknowledge the existence of corporate culture, which discourages open communication between management and workers, and then recognize that it is the management's responsibility to not only create an unrestricted work atmosphere but also acknowledge that a certain culture might discourage workers from communicating with managers. The management should realize that they are the ones who specify the work environment that eventually forms the corporate culture. Otherwise, the lack of democratic discourse can be one of the main causes for a company to fall apart.

Factors Influencing ESG Disclosure for Japanese Corporations

<Abstract>

The purpose of this paper is to identify the determinants of ESG disclosure for Japanese corporations, especially the influence of foreign stock ownership ratio and overseas sales ratio. The sample is based on a cross section of data from 1,137 Japanese corporations in 2015. A logistic regression model is used. The dependent variable is whether or not the firm discloses ESG information to institutional investors. The results show that there is a positive correlation between ESG disclosure and both foreign stock ownership ratio and overseas sales ratio. Firm size, profitability, and industry are also shown to affect the ESG disclosure.
